
## LIZARDS on the South East Islets

## **LAND BIRDS on Ile aux Aigrettes**



Bojer's skink

Gloden brown with black markings. Skinks have claws. Lives in the grass.



In the breeding season, the male's head turns red, as compared to the Madagascar Fody whose whole body turns red.





Bouton's skink Silvery grey with black markings. Lives in rocky areas.

saved from extinction.

These islets are one of the last places where unique (endemic) Mauritian lizards and birds still live. The Mauritian Wildlife Foundation works with Durrell and National Parks and Conservation Service to protect and save these threatened species from extinction.

Fires have destroyed parts of Ile aux Fouquets, its plants and its animals. You can help reduce risks: PLEASE USE A PORTABLE BBQ & TAKE USED CHARCOAL HOME







The endemic plants and trees on the islets are protected by law.
Please help protect plants:
DO NOT CLIMB, CUT OR ATTACH ROPES







To stay healthy birds need to eat their natural diet of insects and nectar.

PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE BIRDS







Seabirds nest in the cliffs. The cliffs can also be unstable and dangerous.

PLEASE AVOID THE CLIFFS







These exotic species, including pets, are a danger to endemic animals and plants.

Before leaving for the islands:

PLEASE CHECK YOUR BOATS AND BAGS

Please do not bring pets to the islets.
